JOINTLY DEVELOPED

Title I is a federally funded program that provides financial assistance and program support to schools with high percentages of low-income families. - *Utilize supplemental staff to support instructional delivery.*
- Utilize a walkthrough tool to monitor lesson plan and instructional delivery effectiveness.

- Develop informal tools for assessment and utilize data for next steps to instructional delivery.
- Utilize district resources for reading and math to plan rigorous units for delivery.
