WORKING WEDNESDAYS

All schools in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County School system have transitioned from Flex Fridays to Flex Wednesdays. To emphasize the point that **Flex days are not free days**, we've changed the name to "Working Wednesdays".

Working Wednesdays allow more flexible learning opportunities to help students manage their academics in this new school environment.



What should I do on Working Wednesdays?

Students should participate in the following:

- ☐ Asynchronous work. Sign into each teacher's Canvas page to complete the independent learning assignment.
 - These assignments must be completed in order to be marked "present" for that class period.
 - Students will be marked "absent" if the assignment is not completed or if they do not engage in one of the following activities:
- ☐ **Tutoring.** Get extra help in individual or small group sessions with your teacher.
 - Each WSPA teacher is available for at least one Open Office Hour during the week and on Working Wednesday.
 - Winston-Salem State University students will also be available to provide extra support to WSPA students from 1:00-3:00 pm on Wednesdays. Zoom link coming soon!
- ☐ Catch up. Use Wednesdays to make sure you are caught up on any missing assignments. You can also use this time to redo assignments or retake assessments that you didn't do well on. Discuss these options with your teacher.
- ☐ Clubs. Participate in extracurricular activities on Wednesdays. Be on the lookout for club meeting dates!

Did You Know?

Winston-Salem Preparatory Academy @ Atkins (WSPA) is housed in the former Atkins High School. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Atkins High School was dedicated on April 2, 1931. WSPA was created as a magnet school to attract highly motivated students whose primary interest is to prepare themselves for a 4-year university education.

The former Atkins High School owes its name to Dr. Simon Green Atkins. Dr. Atkins was instrumental in founding, in 1892, the precursor to what is now Winston-Salem State University. The Atkins name was transferred to a new "Simon G. Atkins Academic and Technology High School" in September 2006 but the spirit of Dr. Atkins lives on at WSPA.

1930: Work began on Atkins High School, the first modern high school for African Americans in Winston-Salem. The school was named for Simon G. Atkins, the founder of Winston-Salem State University. Until the 1960s, it was the only high school for blacks in the city limits.

CHAMPIONS

1953: Atkins won its first state basketball championship in the N.C. Negro High School Athletic Association.

1954: Atkins won the state's first football championship in the association.
