



# AP HUMAN GEOGRAPHY

## Description

AP Human Geography introduces students to the systematic study of patterns and processes that have shaped human understanding, use, and alteration of Earth's surface. Students employ spatial concepts and landscape analysis to analyze human social organization and its environmental consequences. They also learn about the methods and tools geographers use in their science and practice.

The course introduces students to the importance of spatial organization—the location of places, peoples, and events, and the connections among places and landscapes—in the understanding of human life on Earth.

This course is available to 10<sup>th</sup> grade students (if space is available) as well as juniors and seniors.
