Scores Arrive	Early 2018: Score reports will be distributed in homerooms.
What is Measured?	Evidence-Based Reading & Writing (Reading, Writing & Language); Math
Test Format	<p>Reading: 47 questions/ 60 minutes</p> <p>Writing & Language: 44 questions/ 35 minutes</p> <p>Math: 48 questions/ 70 minutes</p>
Scholarship Information & Test Use	National Merit scholarships for top-scoring students are available only for 11th graders. Not accepted for college entrance.
Calculator Information	On the calculator-allowed portion of the Math Test, all scientific calculators are permitted. Please see the College Board website for a full list.
