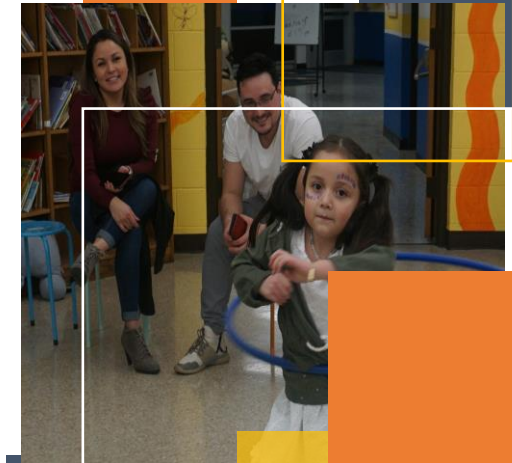
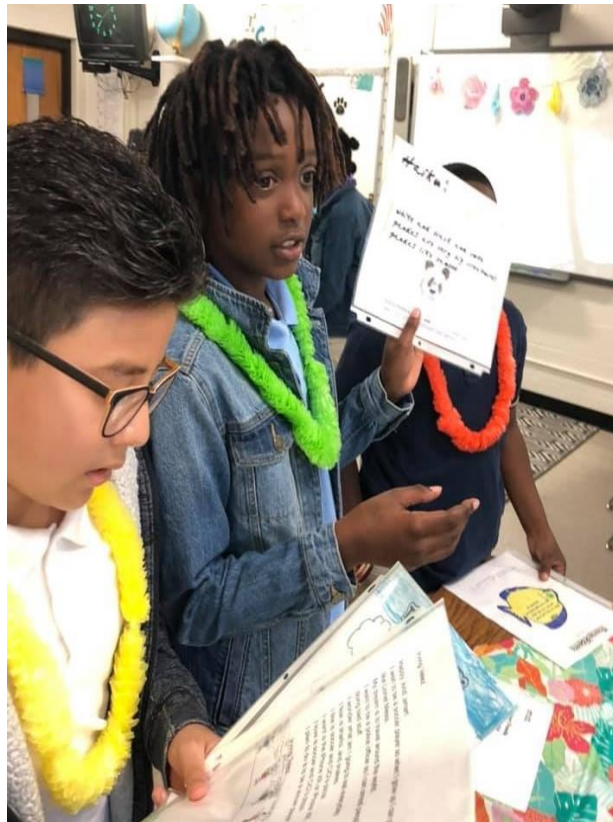

How is it revised?

- ✓ Events and meetings involving parents will be held at various times during the day/week to make it more convenient for families to attend. Family conferences will be scheduled at a time that accommodates the family's availability.
- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, Peachjar and our website. Dr. Frazier posts video updates to Class Dojo on a regular basis.
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ✓ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events, place input cards around the building and a post suggestion form on the school website to respond to parent's request for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
