Purpose of Title 1

Title I, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESSA), is a federally funded program that provides financial assistance to local education agencies (LEAs) and schools. The purpose of the Title I program is to help at-risk students meet the state's challenging academic content and performance standards. Schools qualify for Title I funds based on economic need. The Title I program offers a variety of services for participating schools, which may include additional teachers and support staff, extra time for instruction, a variety of teaching methods and materials, smaller classes, and additional training for staff.

Wiley Curriculum:

Wiley is a STEAM Magnet School, where Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math drive instruction. Wiley teachers utilize North Carolina Standard Course of Study for math and reading, the North Carolina Essential Standards for science and social studies and the North Carolina Standard Course of Study for encore courses to guide our instructional planning and curriculum decisions. Additionally, in the English as a Second Language classes, teachers utilize the WIDA standards to design instruction to meet students' needs. Wiley supports students with diverse needs. Wiley also serves students with various exceptionalities including sensory impairments and cognitive needs.
