- Winston-Salem Foundation Scholarships (most have a March 15 deadline): the WSF scholarships listed below have had NO applicants thus far – apply by accessing the General Application at the following link: <https://wsfoundation.academicworks.com/>
 - o Katie Sleaf Memorial Scholarship - intended for a female student who has been active in the fine arts, especially music
 - o Sam L. Booke, Sr. Scholarship . The Sam L. Booke, Sr. Scholarship was established in 1989 in honor of Sam L. Booke, Sr. to provide \$1,500 renewable scholarships to graduating high school seniors from the public high schools in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County School system who will major in mathematics. This scholarship seeks to encourage outstanding students to pursue careers in the mathematics field.
 - o A.F. Clement Trust Scholarship. The A.F. Clement Trust Scholarship was established in 1970 and repurposed in 2011 to provide scholarships for students who have been in foster care or had two deceased parents prior to the student's 18th birthday. The scholarship may provide up to two \$2,000 renewable awards for students who will pursue post-secondary education or vocational training leading to a certificate, degree, or diploma.
 - o Tripp Joye Memorial Scholarship. The Tripp Joye Memorial Scholarship was established in 2009 in memory of Milbourne L. Joye, III to provide scholarships to graduating high school seniors from Forsyth County who will pursue full-time undergraduate degrees in music, preferably in the area of percussion, from accredited post-secondary institutions.
 - o Douglas Gray Kimel Scholarship. The Douglas Gray Kimel Scholarship was established by Calvary Moravian Church in 2007 to honor Doug Kimel's service in music ministry. The scholarship may provide a \$700 non-renewable award for students who will pursue full-time undergraduate degrees in music from accredited post-secondary institutions.
 - o Albert Morgan, Jr. and Olivia E. Morgan Scholarship. The Albert Morgan, Jr. and Olivia E. Morgan Scholarship was established by Olivia E. Morgan in 2012 to provide scholarships to graduating high school seniors who attend a Forsyth County high school and reside in the Foundation's service area. The scholarship may provide a \$1,000 non-renewable award for students who will pursue full-time undergraduate degrees from a historically black college or university in the U.S. and intend to major in

education or hospitality.

- o Evelyn Ripple Winston-Salem Beta Sigma Phi Scholarship. The Evelyn Ripple Winston-Salem Beta Sigma Phi Scholarship was established in March 1999 by Winston-Salem Beta Sigma Phi to provide scholarships for students who will enroll in an accredited post-secondary educational institution. Preference for the scholarship will be given to Forsyth County Beta Sigma Phi members or members of their families if there are no qualified applicants from Forsyth County, consideration will be given to applicants without regard to geographic location.
- o Woodbine Big Dreams Scholarship. The Woodbine Big Dreams Scholarship was established in 2011 to help inspire the next generation of creative thinkers, writers and commercial artists in the Winston-Salem community. The annual scholarship is awarded to graduating high school seniors who attend a Forsyth County high school, reside in the Foundation's service area, and who will pursue a career in the communication arts field.

Opportunity at Forsyth Tech for students looking for job training and placement:

The Summer Production Technician Program (PTP) is the pre-apprenticeship for LEAP@ForsythTech, or the Learn and Earn Apprenticeship Program. If selected as an apprentice after completing the PTP, the student will be hired full time by an employer partner and given paid time away from work to attend Forsyth Tech. Current apprentice positions include: Computer Numerical Controlled (CNC) Machining, Mechatronics/Maintenance Tech, Quality Control Tech and Manufacturing Tech.

The application is now open with a priority deadline of April 1st. Details about class days/times can be found at the application link. Please note: we have shortened this class from full days to half days.
