

What is Title I?

Ibraham Elementary School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is a federal program designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement.

Ibraham Elementary School Goals 2021-22 School Year

Ibraham's School Improvement Team developed four focus goals aimed towards being student centered and improving our Culture, Climate, and Communication.

- **Goal 1:** Ibraham will increase reading proficiency by 10% all grade levels K-5th as measured by the EOG (3-5) and state approved assessment (K-2).
- **Goal 2:** Ibraham will close the achievement gap by 10 percentage points in math, reading, and Students with Disabilities as measured by the EOG testing.
- **Goal 3:** Ibraham will decrease office referral, in-school and out of school suspension by 10% to ensure our school culture is conducive for learning.
- **Goal 4:** Ibraham will increase family and community partnerships by 5% to connect and obtain parent and community buy-in and resources to meet the needs of the school.

- Keep a calendar for important dates related to school, like events to attend, conferences, PTA meetings, and other opportunities to participate in decision-making in support of your student and their school
