R.J. Reynolds High School, located in the heart of Winston-Salem, NC, was founded in 1923. As the oldest continuously operating public high school in Winston-Salem and Forsyth County, Reynolds maintains the "tradition of excellence" upon which the school was founded. In 2007, Reynolds became an arts magnet high school and launched the "arts for academics" curriculum that weaves arts education, arts exposure, and arts integration into the high school experience. Reynolds is among a select group of public magnet schools in North Carolina that is recognized nationally as both a Magnet School of America and a Kennedy Center School of Excellence.

"Amid the pines, she proudly stands," Reynolds serves a diverse population of close to 1,750 students from throughout the entire city and county. The students from our residential zone make up 67% of our student body. The remaining 33% attend through a magnet application and lottery process that typically generates a waiting list of more than 115 students. Representing more than 24 countries, our student body is comprised of 39% White, 34% Black, 16% Hispanic, 6% Multi-Racial and 5% Asian students. Additionally, approximately 50% of our students qualify for the free and reduced lunch program. In the graduating class of 2020, 78% of our students went on to further their education after high school.

All students at Reynolds attend four, 90-minute classes daily on A-day/B-day, 4x4, and hybrid schedules. Our vibrant arts curriculum includes 62 distinct visual and performing arts courses and fills more than 2,100 arts class seats every day. Some of our students also attend the Career Center High School, which enriches their academic experiences through specialty Advanced Placement and Career/Technical courses.

Reynolds is in the 4A Central Piedmont Athletic Conference. We support 40 athletic teams on which more than 40% of our students compete and proudly wear our "black and gold" as they represent the Demons as student athletes.
