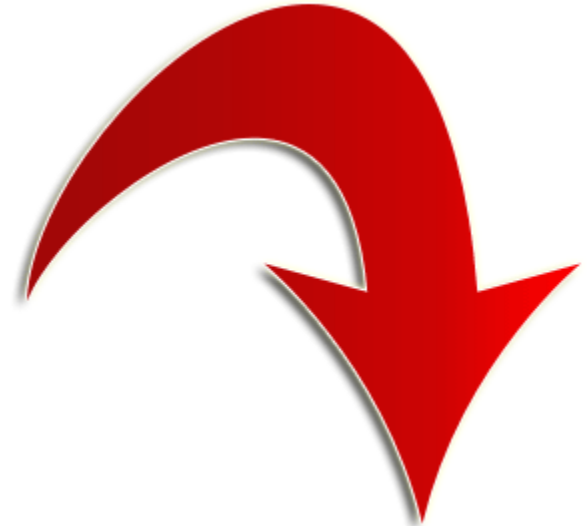

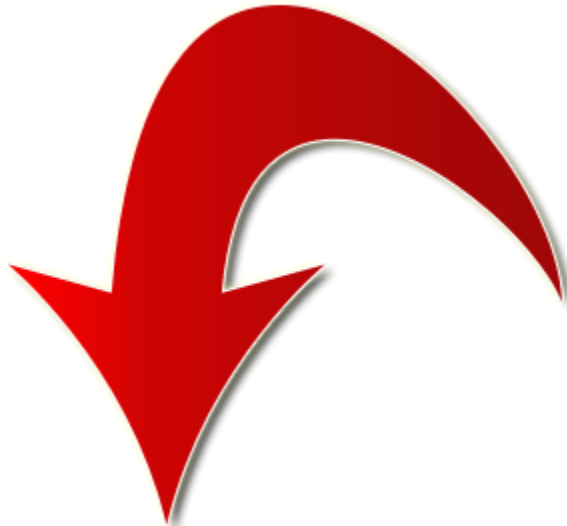

Math scores experience a 24.2% drop after the introduction of new rigorous standards

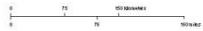
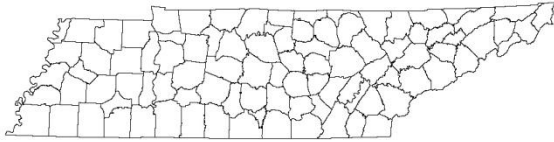

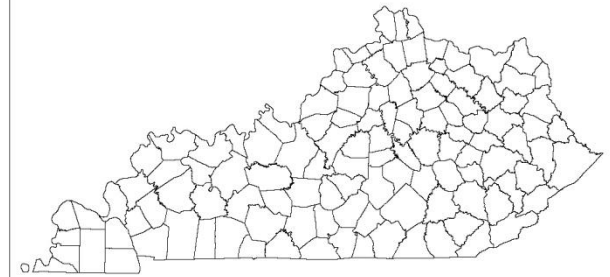
