What is the collective victory for our community when young people overcome these challenges and become stronger by refusing to be defined by difficulties?

- 1250 - 1500 word length
- 12pt font (Times Roman or similar standard font)
- Double-spaced
- Must be proofread by teacher or school staff.

- Ensure that all words are spelled correctly.
- Check grammar, structure, and punctuation rules if you're unsure.
